**AMENDED STANDING ORDER RELATING TO**  
**TEXT-ONLY ORDERS AND NOTICES**

This matter is before the Court to establish procedures for entry of text-only orders and notices in the Court's CM/ECF electronic filing system.

THE COURT FINDS:

A. For routine orders and notices where it would be more efficient to enter the text of the order or notice onto the docket, rather than drafting, signing, and filing a separate document (referred to herein as a "Text-Only" order or notice), Text-Only orders and notices are sufficient.

B. Text-Only orders and notices would be more efficient to prepare and review via e-mail and would conserve judicial and other resources.

C. Text-Only orders and notices would save money for CM/ECF users, since they would not have to pay the costs associated with downloading paper orders or notices.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

1. All Court orders and notices will continue to be filed electronically. An order or notice may be Text-Only. A Text-Only order or notice, together with the Notice of Electronic Filing, shall constitute a complete and sufficient order or notice.

2. Any Text-Only order or notice by a judge, or a Text-Only notice by the Clerk of Court, shall have the same force and effect as if the judge or Clerk had affixed their signature to

a paper copy of the order or notice and entered the signed document on the docket in the usual manner.


3. Text-Only orders or notices shall begin with: "TEXT-ONLY ORDER [OR NOTICE] by \_\_\_\_\_ [presiding judge or Clerk of Court].

4. Text-Only orders and notices shall end with: "THIS IS A TEXT-ONLY ENTRY. THERE ARE NO DOCUMENTS ATTACHED. [initials of deputy clerk making the docket entry]."

5. The Notice of Electronic Filing created by the ECF System shall serve as a Certificate of Service for all Text-Only orders and notices.

6. This order supersedes the previously entered order of February 5, 2015, on this subject.
